

DON BOSCO (1815-1888)

His vision ... our inspiration

Saint John Bosco, popularly known as Don Bosco was born at Becchi, in Piedmont, Italy, on August 16, 1815. From a very young age, he had decided that he had been called to work for the poor boys of that era, when Europe was under the grip of the Industrial Revolution, and many young people who came to the cities to study or in search of work who fell an easy prey to the many social evils of the time. After being ordained a priest of the Catholic Church in 1841, Don Bosco came to the rescue of these poor boys with his novel method of educating youth through total dedication and personal involvement in their lives and problems.

To ensure that his total dedication to their cause shone through his actions, he based his education on the three great principles of REASON, RELIGION and LOVING KINDNESS, loving those to whom he dedicated his life, as a caring father, and doing everything possible for their welfare. Don Bosco was attuned to the needs of his society. He did not visualise education in isolation from the community within whose parameters it functioned. Vocational guidance, vocational training, job placement and follow-up were as integral to Don Bosco's scheme of things as they are in modern education.

The system of education that emerged from these principles of Don Bosco is popularly known as the Preventive System and is the system that is used in St. Anthony's College. Joseph Zoppi, the Swiss educationist said, "If there ever existed a method of education adapted to inspire confidence and love, it is the method of Don Bosco."



College with Potential for Excellence UGC (2006 Onwards)

St. Anthony's College, Shillong, the first College in the North East to have been accredited (2000) by NAAC with a grade of five stars, was awarded the coveted status of "College with Potential for Excellence" (CPE), by the University Grants Commission (UGC) on 7th April 2006.

The award of the CPE status is a form of recognition by the UGC to Colleges, which are functioning well and have the potential to do excellent work in teaching and research. Out of the 16,100 Colleges in India which are eligible, the UGC has the objective of awarding the CPE status to about 160 Colleges (i.e. 1%). We are proud that St. Anthony's College is placed among the top one percent of the large number of Colleges in India. The status was re-confirmed in 2009 and in 2014 till date.



DBT STAR COLLEGE SCHEME (2009 ONWARDS)

St. Anthony's College enjoys the support of the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Ministry of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India under the DBT Star College Scheme since 2009. Six departments – Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology are currently supported. The Scheme is aimed at improving and strengthening science education at the undergraduate level by imparting both hands-on skills and inter-departmental involvement to ensure the holistic development of the undergraduate students. With the support of the scheme, the students of the supported departments have shown tremendous progress in terms of pass percentage, progression on to higher studies and research with a marked improvement in skills imparted by hands-on activities. The faculty also enjoy the support in terms of funding for training programmes, workshops and seminars. The College is presently supported in the second phase of the scheme and is determined to continue striving towards excellence.

Hospitality department offers a 6 months Diploma in Hospitality Management course. The course is affiliated to Info Valley Research and Educational Ltd., Guwahati and in collaboration with Jettwings Institute, Shillong. The course was launch in May 2019. Hospitality course is a job oriented course that offers industrial internship and job placement in well-known 5 hotels and resorts within the state and all over India. Training is given in areas, such as, Front Office Associate, Food and Beverage Associate and Housekeeping Associate inclusive of Personality development, Grooming, Communication skills and interview skills. During the course, students are taken for hotel Tour for practical knowledge and familiarization of the industry and as well as cross exposure training at Jettwings Institute Shillong. In completion of the 6 months Diploma course, students are placed for internship and job placement. To name a few hotels where students are placed: Taj Lands' End Mumbai, The Oberoi Rajvillas Jaipur, Trident Bandra Kurla Mumbai, The Oberoi Grand Kolkata, Bay Club Mumbai, Clarks Exotic Bangalore, Courtyard by Marriot Shillong Vivanta Shillong and Royal View Resort Cherrapunjee. 

GENERAL INFORMATION

ADMISSIONS

UNDER GRADUATE COURSES

The admission process for the FYUG Programmes commences after the declaration of the results of the HSSLC Examinations (Arts, Commerce, Science and Vocational) of the Meghalaya Board and the CUET results.

- The College is desirous of maintaining a 60 - 40 ratio of boys to girls in its undergraduate admission.
- Outstanding sports persons who have made distinction at the State and National levels will be accorded special consideration
- Some seats are reserved for differently-abled persons, minimum eligibility criteria, however, will be applicable.
- The college follows its own Admission Policy (<https://anthony.ac.in/pages/policies/policies.php>).
- The management reserves the right to grant or deny admission.
- Reserved seats for Management in every shift of a programme is 10%.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is compulsory. A student absenting himself/herself from one or more classes will lose the day's attendance. Students having less than 75% attendance are liable to be debarred from Examinations. Any student who is absent for one month will have his/her name removed from the College Registers. Admission Fees will have to be paid anew if the student is allowed to join back.

ASSESSMENT OF STUDENTS

Continuous assessment of the students is done by the college through regular tests, projects and assignments. There will be Sessional tests and internal assessment tests. If a student does not pass he / she may be debarred from appearing in the End Semester Examinations. The marks secured by the students at these assessment tests are taken into consideration at the time of sending up the students for University Examinations. The Examination Committee's decision in this regard is final and binding.

A keen sense of discipline, a more-than-average capacity for sustained study and a sincere readiness to live as brothers/sisters with members of other communities are necessary conditions to get a seat in the hostel and retain it.

LIBRARY





NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)



The Coaching Programme organised by the SDS each year is aimed at preparing the students of Life Sciences for the M.Sc (Biotechnology) entrance tests conducted by JNU and by the IITs (JAM). As the students of Life Sciences are typically out of touch with Mathematics and Physics during their years of graduate studies and as these subjects form an integral part of the entrance tests, this coaching programme concentrates on Physics and Mathematics required for these tests.

An introductory course in Personal Computer Software is conducted every year by the Cyber Club of the College. The Course is conducted by the student - members of the Cyber Club for other students who have not been introduced to computers.

The Orientation Programme organised at the beginning of each academic year by the SDS for the students of the college has the purpose of fostering personal growth, interpersonal relationship and principles of value-based life style in an atmosphere of friendship and informality. The programme helps the students to meet their companions in a non-academic atmosphere and sow the seeds of mutual understanding and friendship among them. This is essential, considering the multi-ethnic make up of the students of the college.

The National Service Scheme is a voluntary organisation of College Students under the Union Ministry of Human Resource Development established during 1969-70 to inculcate social consciousness and a sense of responsibility, discipline and dignity of labour among the youth. The College Unit of the NSS is vibrant with activities and takes up a number of adult education and health-education programmes each year under the guidance of the dedicated Programme Officers.



NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

NCC (National Cadet Corps) is a national organisation which has helped in inculcating in the cadets a spirit of courage, confidence, self-reliance, selfless service, a feeling of patriotism, faith in oneself, power of thought and adjustment which are essential to make the youth disciplined and dutiful. St. Anthony's College is attached to the 41 Meghalaya Artillery Battery NCC and 61 Meghalaya Girls' Bn NCC for NCC activities under the leadership of Shri G. S. Swett (Boys) and Smt Dayomika R. Kharsyntiew (Girls).



Rangers' and Rovers' Wings have been started in the College with a view to providing students with ample opportunities for personal development and avenues for meaningful involvement in outreach programmes.

The college encourages the formation of student clubs under the guidance of the teaching staff. The clubs functioning in the College are: The Environmental Club under the Department of Botany, the Media Club under the Department of Mass Communication, the Cyber Club under the Department of Computer Science, the Literary Club of the Department of English are doing a splendid job. The Botanical Garden of the College, maintained by the Department of Botany is the storehouse of a variety of rare species of plants. A Software Development Cell has been functioning in the College for the past several years having to its credit several original software packages that have been developed and implemented in a number of institutions. The tissue culture enthusiasts in the Department of Biotechnology have had considerable success in the mass multiplication and propagation of ornamental plants. Groups of students are actively involved in science projects sponsored by the Department of Science & Technology (Government of Meghalaya) and research projects undertaken by the Staff sponsored by a variety of Central Government agencies: Tissue culture in orchids (Department of Botany)-DBT, Induced Breeding of Fish (Department of Fishery Science)-DST, Pesticides & Insecticides (Department of Chemistry)-ICAR, NATP, CGP - II, UGC.

Since 1995, the SDS, a brainchild of the College and supported by the All India Association for Christian Higher Education, has been a beacon of holistic student development. Offering personal, educational, and vocational guidance, it tackles societal threats like alcoholism, drug abuse, and AIDS through education and prevention. GENERAL NORMS


1. The college has introduced a policy on uniform from academic session 2023-24. **It is mandatory for all the students of the college to wear uniform.**


