


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DON BOSCO (1815-1888)

His vision ... our inspiration

Saint John Bosco, popularly known as Don Bosco was born at Becchi, in Piedmont, Italy, on August 16, 1815. From a very young age, he had decided that he had been called to work for the poor boys of that era, when Europe was under the grip of the Industrial Revolution, and many young people who came to the cities to study or in search of work who fell an easy prey to the many social evils of the time. After being ordained a priest of the Catholic Church in 1841, Don Bosco came to the rescue of these poor boys with his novel method of educating youth through total dedication and personal involvement in their lives and problems.

To ensure that his total dedication to their cause shone through his actions, he based his education on the three great principles of REASON, RELIGION and LOVING KINDNESS, loving those to whom he dedicated his life, as a caring father, and doing everything possible for their welfare. Don Bosco was attuned to the needs of his society. He did not visualise education in isolation from the community within whose parameters it functioned. Vocational guidance, vocational training, job placement and follow-up were as integral to Don Bosco's scheme of things as they are in modern education.

The system of education that emerged from these principles of Don Bosco is popularly known as the Preventive System and is the system that is used in St. Anthony's College. Joseph Zoppi, the Swiss educationist said, "If there ever existed a method of education adapted to inspire confidence and love, it is the method of Don Bosco."



College with Potential for Excellence UGC (2006 Onwards)

St. Anthony's College, Shillong, the first College in the North East to have been accredited (2000) by NAAC with a grade of five stars, was awarded the coveted status of "College with Potential for Excellence" (CPE), by the University Grants Commission (UGC) on 7th April 2006.

The award of the CPE status is a form of recognition by the UGC to Colleges, which are functioning well and have the potential to do excellent work in teaching and research. Out of the 16,100 Colleges in India which are eligible, the UGC has the objective of awarding the CPE status to about 160 Colleges (i.e. 1%). We are proud that St. Anthony's College is placed among the top one percent of the large number of Colleges in India. The status was re-confirmed in 2009 and in 2014 till date.



DBT STAR COLLEGE SCHEME (2009 ONWARDS)

St. Anthony's College enjoys the support of the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Ministry of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India under the DBT Star College Scheme since 2009. Six departments – Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology are currently supported. The Scheme is aimed at improving and strengthening science education at the undergraduate level by imparting both hands-on skills and inter-departmental involvement to ensure the holistic development of the undergraduate students. With the support of the scheme, the students of the supported departments have shown tremendous progress in terms of pass percentage, progression on to higher studies and research with a marked improvement in skills imparted by hands-on activities. The faculty also enjoy the support in terms of funding for training programmes, workshops and seminars. The College is presently supported in the second phase of the scheme and is determined to continue striving towards excellence.

1. M. Sc. BIOTECHNOLOGY

India is among the top global biotechnological powers and the number of people employed for research and development in this booming industry grows nearly 50% annually. Blessed with rich natural biodiversity, Meghalaya and the entire North Eastern Region holds great potential and promise in the field of Biotechnology. Keenly aware of these opportunities, **St. Anthony’s College** has initiated the Master of Science Programme in Biotechnology. The principal objective of this post graduate programme is to develop trained man power who can exploit the abundant bio-resources of the North-Eastern region, particularly Meghalaya. The rich bio-diversity of the North East provides many opportunities to the youth to build careers in areas that utilise life forms for the production of consumer items. Apart from teaching the commercialisation of bio-techniques, the course also aims to equip students to explore the molecular basis of biological diversity using the current techniques in genomic and the proteomics, so that they develop a deeper understanding of eco-systems and contribute to sustainable development of the Northeast.

2. MASTER OF COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (MCA)



For the last several years now, *St. Anthony's College* has been in the vanguard of Professional Education in the North Eastern region of India. In pursuance of its continued efforts, it has introduced the Post Graduate Programme of Master of Computer Applications (MCA) from 2007. The college is affiliated to the North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) and approved by All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) to offer the MCA programme. This two-year Master of Computer Applications (MCA) course aims to prepare candidates for the IT industry. It will provide the necessary theoretical foundation and the skills to make the successful candidates proficient in software development, paving the way for self-employment. The core

focus of the course is on Database, Application Programming, System Level Programming and Network and Internet Technologies. Adequate emphasis is given to the Open Source Software platform and emerging technologies. The need for continuity in the electives offered in the second and third semesters, leading to desired specialisation, has been given due attention.

The Audit Courses included in the syllabus, one per year, would give the candidates soft skills necessary for the employment market.

4. MASTER OF ARTS IN EDUCATION (M.A.)

6. POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (PGDCA)

The Post Graduate Diploma Course in Computer Applications (PGDCA) is a one-year course spread over two semesters. It starts in July every year. The course content is modelled after the syllabi of comparable programmes conducted by the top universities of India and the DOEACC (Ministry of Information Technology, Government of India, and AICTE).

The course is employment-oriented. It provides a strong foundation in the theoretical concepts of computer science as well as a firm grounding in Visual Programming Languages. Started in 1993, the course content has been constantly updated to realise its main objectives. It is designed to enable one to undertake software applications for business and industry. Successful candidates could also opt for a teaching career in secondary and higher secondary schools. The final diploma is awarded by the North Eastern Hill University after completion of the second semester examinations. Being a recognised Post-Graduate Diploma from a Central University, it commands wider acceptability and prestige compared to the Certificates awarded by computer training institutes.

During the course, students are taken for hotel Tour for practical knowledge and familiarization of the industry and as well as cross exposure training at Jettwings Institute Shillong. In completion of the 6 months Diploma course, students are placed for internship and job placement. To name a few hotels where students are placed: Taj Lands' End Mumbai, The Oberoi Rajvillas Jaipur, Trident Bandra Kurla Mumbai, The Oberoi Grand Kolkata, Bay Club Mumbai, Clarks Exotic Bangalore, Courtyard by Marriot Shillong Vivanta Shillong and Royal View Resort Cherrapunjee. Hands on Theory and Practical from Monday to Friday (1 Hour session). It gives an opportunity to under graduates as well to enroll for Hospitality management course while pursuing their degree.



ADMISSIONS

UNDER GRADUATE COURSES

The admission process for the FYUG Programmes commences after the declaration of the results of the HSSLC Examinations (Arts, Commerce, Science and Vocational) of the Meghalaya Board and the CUET results.

- The College is desirous of maintaining a 60 - 40 ratio of boys to girls in its undergraduate admission.
- Outstanding sports persons who have made distinction at the State and National levels will be accorded special consideration
- Some seats are reserved for differently-abled persons, minimum eligibility criteria, however, will be applicable.

- The management reserves the right to grant or deny admission.
- Reserved seats for Management in every shift of a programme is 10%.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is compulsory. A student absenting himself/herself from one or more classes will lose the day's attendance. Students having less than 75% attendance are liable to be debarred from Examinations. Any student who is absent for one month will have his/her name removed from the College Registers. Admission Fees will have to be paid anew if the student is allowed to join back.

ASSESSMENT OF STUDENTS

Continuous assessment of the students is done by the college through regular tests, projects and assignments. There will be Sessional tests and internal assessment tests. If a student does not pass he / she may be debarred from appearing in the End Semester Examinations. The marks secured by the students at these assessment tests are taken into consideration at the time of sending up the students for University Examinations. The Examination Committee's decision in this regard is final and binding.



M.SC (BIOTECHNOLOGY) COACHING PROGRAMME



TISSUE CULTURE

The Coaching Programme organised by the SDS each year is aimed at preparing the students of Life Sciences for the M.Sc (Biotechnology) entrance tests conducted by JNU and by the IITs (JAM). As the students of Life Sciences are typically out of touch with Mathematics and Physics during their years of graduate studies and as these subjects form an integral part of the entrance tests, this coaching programme concentrates on Physics and Mathematics required for these tests.

SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT TEAM

A Software Development Cell has been functioning in the College for the past several years having to its credit several original software packages that have been developed and implemented in a number of institutions.

The tissue culture enthusiasts in the Department of Biotechnology have had considerable success in the mass multiplication and propagation of ornamental plants. Groups of students are actively involved in science projects sponsored by the Department of Science & Technology (Government of Meghalaya) and research projects undertaken by the Staff sponsored by a variety of Central Government agencies: Tissue culture in orchids (Department of Botany)-DBT, Induced Breeding of Fish (Department of Fishery Science)-DST, Pesticides & Insecticides (Department of Chemistry)-ICAR, NATP, CGP - II, UGC.



SPORTS

Sports, both outdoor and indoor, play a very important role in the life of St. Anthony's College. Every Anthonian is encouraged to take an active part in the sports activities of the College. Within the campus itself, there are two Basketball courts, two Volleyball courts, a Badminton Court and a Tennis court. It also has access to the mini stadium at the old campus of the College for Football. Apart from this, facilities for almost every indoor game is provided within the college itself. 

GENERAL NORMS


1. The college has introduced a policy on uniform from academic session 2023-24. **It is mandatory for all the students of the college to wear uniform.**


